## The Lou Anna Rollins Scholarship for Recent High School Graduates

If you are a recent high school graduate and wish to receive the Lou Anna Rollins Scholarship for a degree program at a university or college. To be eligible you must:

- Be a legal resident of the United States of America.
- Be a graduating high school senior
- Earn a "B" average in high school (a 3.25 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or 85

numeric grade average, meeting the college preparatory track, meeting the curriculum

requirements.)

Students who graduate from high school in the year 2021 and thereafter will be required to earn a "B" average in their core-curriculum subjects. Check with your high school guidance counselor for more information on the core-curriculum requirements.

#### **REQUIRED ITEMS FOR ALL APPLICATIONS:**

- A completed application form
- A high school transcript
- A copy of your resume
- A statement describing yourself and why you want to go to college 250 to 500 words
- Two (2) letters of recommendations from your principal, pastor, or faculty member explaining why you are a good candidate for this award.
- Volunteer work history

Applications must be submitted no later than April 29, 2021.
